

## Quotes

No difference between ' and ". If you want to use ' inside string, use " and vice versa. Lua handles backslash as escape character:

```
a  bell
b  back space
f  form feed
n  newline
r  carriage return
t  horizontal tab
v  vertical tab
\  backslash
"  double quote
'  single quote
[  left square bracket
]  right square bracket
```

Also ASCII decimal value can be specified after backslash **\ddd**

```
print ("my new string")
print ('my new string')
print ('my new string with double quote " inside')
print ("my new string with single quote ' inside")
print ('my new string with single quote \' inside')
print ('my new string with single quote \\\' inside') -- will print "... \'
... "
print ('my new string with single quote \039 inside')
-- to treat string as literal, and do not handle escape character , use
square brackets [[...]]
print ([[my new string with single quote \' inside]]) -- will print "... \'
... "
```
