

sys

sys.exit()

Always use `sys.exit()` to exit in production code. Built-in's like `quit` or `exit` can be omitted in some envs.

os._exit()

os._exit(n) Exit the process with status `n`, without calling cleanup handlers, flushing stdio buffers, etc.

Note: The standard way to exit is `sys.exit(n)`. `_exit()` should normally only be used in the child process after a `fork()`.

exit codes

`os.EX_OK`
